Amuleek Singh Bijral is CEO and Co-Founder of Chai Point, which is revolutionizing the way chai (tea) is consumed in India. Beginning with its first store in 2010, Chai Point has rapidly grown sell over 300,000 cups of tea every day. Before starting


Mountain Trail Foods Private Limited (Chai Point is a brand under it), he was the

country manager for RSA, an information security company. He is a graduate of Thapar University, Punjab and received his MBA from Harvard Business School. Akanksha Hazari is Founder and CEO of m.Paani, which connects brands directly to mass-market consumers and unorganized retail with India's first and only data, loyalty

and marketing platform. The proprietary data enables the company to deliver intelligence to its partners. She is the winner of the Vital Voices Global Leadership Economic Empowerment Award 2016 and Google India Rising Star Award 2014, among others. She is a graduate of Princeton University and University of Cambridge.


